Who We Serve

Adult Behavioral Health

Adults with behavioral health issues including mental health and substance use

Youth Behavioral Health

Youth with behavioral health issues including mental health and substance use, and their families

Community Care

Children, adolescents, and adults with employment and behavioral health care needs

Housing

Adults, and families who need housing and other support services

Court and Corrections

Adult offenders involved in the criminal justice system and their families

Fiscal Year 2017

- Provided services in Brown, Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Hamilton, and Warren counties in Ohio
- Served almost 36,000 children, adolescents, and adults face-to-face
- An additional 34,000 were reached through prevention services

The Fatherhood Project's History

- Started as a program of Services United for Mothers & Adolescents (SUMA) back in 1998
- Original concept was to serve teen fathers
- Funded by the O'Neill Foundation out of Cleveland
- United Way of Greater Cincinnati
- Transition to Talbert House on July 1, 2008

New Fatherhood Services

Early Intervention

- Funded by Hamilton County Jobs & Family Services
- Services are for non-custodial parents with a first time child support order in Hamilton County

New Beginnings for New Fathers

- Funded by The United States Department of Health and Human Services
- Partnership with the Ohio Fatherhood Commission







Number of Women Fathers Have Children With


