- An additional 78,200 were reached through prevention and hotline services

# The Fatherhood Project's History

- Started as a program of Services United for Mothers & Adolescents (SUMA) back in 1998
- Original concept was to serve teen fathers
- Funded by the O'Neill Foundation out of Cleveland
- United Way of Greater Cincinnati
- Transition to Talbert House on July 1, 2008





Income at Intake





Mothers of Child per Father






